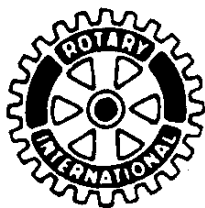

The Waunakee Rotary Club inducted two new members at its Aug. 2 meeting.

Club President Lynne Spielman said a third member will be inducted, as well.

The club held club assembly and met in committees.

Greg Garton of the Interact committee noted that the club is gearing up for an exchange student to arrive from Brazil Aug. 17.

Greg said the Interact committee, which works with the new high school Rotary Interact club, is looking for freshmen and sophomores to join to sustain the high school club membership.

Club members who intend to volunteer with the youths need to fill out background check forms as required by Rotary International.

Phil Willems of the fund-raising committee said the Waunafest stand was more successful than last year. Phil said the committee is considering selling more advertising in other areas this year.

Dan Statz reminded the club that the next fund-raising event is the Oktoberfest. It will benefit three organizations, the Rotary, Lions Club and the Waunakee Community Foundation. It's a lot of fun, and it takes a great deal of volunteerism, Dan said.

Bill Erickson from the international committee said the board approved the solicitation of a grant of \$2,000 for a literacy project in Nigeria. Lynn added that the entire cost for Education for Life is \$12,000.

Also, Bill said the cost for the home to be built in Haiti had gone up, and the club chipped in another \$200 to supplement the \$1,800 donated by club members. Club members are welcome to contribute funds to the club to cover the additional cost. Bill, Phil and others going to Haiti will leave Nov. 29 and return Dec. 2.

Tom Reis reported that the parade float at the Waunafest Parade came out nicely. It won an award for the best float by a service organization. The next community service event coming up will be the Thanksgiving breakfast, which Ed Neibuhr and Rich Murphy agreed to help with again. Rotary in Lights will open Nov. 26 this year, he said.

Jim Tubbs of the meetings committee said that parade floats are good public relations for the club. The committee has lined up speakers through the month of October for the meetings, he said. Some of the interesting programs will include Lynne's talk about the Rotary International Convention next week. On Sept. 20, a Holocaust survivor will speak. Rotarians who are inviting prospective members should keep these interesting programs in mind, Jim said.

Roberta Baumann of the membership committee said the committee was pleased to welcome the three new members. The committee is also working on promotional materials to attract new members.
