Rotarians learned a little bit about how the Waunakee club's Web site works at the Feb. 11 meeting.

Bob Pulvermacher is the club's Web master, and he demonstrated all of the site's features.

The top navigation bar features a "What's New" section where visitors can see a list of past activities and view pictures. To the right of that is "Meetings," and then "Fellowship," and "Documents," where newsletters such as this one are archived.

Another page of interest is titled "Clubs" and is a listing of other club meetings Rotarians where can make up missed meetings. The "Site Map" page will give visitors a list of all of the pages on the site.

Members can log in to the Members Only section if they are looking for the following:

- Bulletin board listings for members
- Committee updates
- Optimized version of member roster (270 KB)
- Club members' e-mail addresses
- Members calendar
- Board of Directors meeting minutes.

The password is "rotary" and the login number is "6250."

Bob said club members may find the e-mail address list to be a useful way to get in touch with one another. Also, he said the bulletin board could be utilized more.

Members can find a list of speakers and programs, and at the bottom of the site, a photo of the Rotary Exchange Student. By clicking on Bird's picture, the club can get updates about him and the lat-

est on the youth exchange committee's work.

Phil Willems noted that members can also visit the District's Web site by clicking on the link toward the bottom of the page. There are also links to the Rotary International site.

Links to the left can provide prospective Rotarians with useful information such as a history of the club, its contributions and accomplishments, and a list of club members.

Bob has been keeping this site updated for several years, and it is a useful tool for our club.
