The Waunakee Rotary Club presented a check to Larry Gehri of the Waunakee-Westport Lions Club at the March 5 meeting for that club's help greeting visitors to the Rotary In Lights event.

Larry said the Lions Club has many projects, including participation in an eye bank. The club also works on local community projects, including the upcoming March 7 Health Fair at the Village Center.

Rotary Club Secretary Phil Willems also announced the winners of the Rotary Board board of directors election. John Cullen received the No 1. vote followed by Linda Olson. President elect is Brent Ziegler. Congratulations, Brent, John and Linda, and thank you in advance for your service to the Rotary Board of Directors.

Rotarians held their club assembly, with committees presenting summaries of their projects.

Jim Tubbs reported for the meetings and publicity committee and said the club has speakers lined up until June 11. That committee has been scheduling more local speakers such as the recent Waunakee Police and the Waunakee Fire Department presentations.

Next week, the program will be three classification talks from new members Jon Jordan, Bill Barlow and Mike Ableidinger. Some upcoming programs include Al Dassow on the Waunakee club's foundation March 26 and David May on the InfantSee program on April 16.

Phil reported on the fund-raising. That committee recently participated in the Super Raffle and helped to host Whitetails Unlimited. Now the members are looking forward to Waunafest, Phil said. John Cullen is

also working on a Selection Sunday pool as a fund-raiser.

Bill Erickson said the international committee is planning several projects. On May 7, a Group Study Exchange team from India will visit the area. This is a non-vocational exchange, and Waunakee Rotarians are needed to take the visitors on a tour of Waunakee after the Rotary meeting. A Rotary exchange is also planned in September, and Waunakee Rotarians are needed to host four couples and three individuals for four days. The club will get together for potlucks and provide tours of the area.

Also, the Madison Downtown Club has built a school in the southern part of Peru near Machu Picchu, and Rotarians can visit. The trip's cost is about \$2,000.

Bill said a trip is also planned to Guatemala to revisit the well project there.

Tom Reis said the club is taking on a new community service project – an Easter egg hunt at the Endres Manufacturing grounds. That committee will begin to dismantle the light display at Village Park once the ground dries out.
