At the June 29 meeting, Waunakee Rotarians viewed a video tour of Caraz, Peru, where our club has helped support the sewing machine project.

Under the sewing machine project, unwed mothers learn to sew so they can make a living.

Of the \$5,000 for the project, Waunakee Rotary has provided \$2,250, Rotary District 6250 provided \$1,000, and the Caraz Rotary provided \$500. That leaves \$965 left to raise. Additional donations can be sent to Waunakee Rotary Foundation, P.O. Box 159, Waunakee, Wis. 53597.
